### **John Allegrante**

John Allegrante is Professor of Health Education at Teachers College, Columbia University, where he has been Chairman of the Department of Health and Behavior Studies, Deputy Provost, and Associate Vice President for International Affairs. He holds a joint appointment in Sociomedical Sciences at the Mailman School of Public Health at Columbia and is a member of the Faculty Steering Committee for the Columbia Global Centers | Paris. A Past President and Distinguished Fellow of the Society for Public Health Education, Allegrante has been a Fellow of the W. K. Kellogg Foundation and Pew Charitable Trusts, a Fulbright Scholar, and a visiting scholar with the Soros Open Society Foundations and Erasmus Mundus European Public Health Programme. He is a graduate of the State University of New York and earned M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Illinois. Allegrante was awarded an honorary doctorate from the State University of New York in 2015 and received the Elizabeth Fries Health Education Prize Award from the CDC Foundation in 2017.

### **José Luis Castro**

José Luis Castro is Executive Director of The Union and President & CEO of Vital Strategies. Under Mr Castro's leadership and vision, The Union has expanded its global portfolio of projects and forged new strategic partnerships, including with the Global Fund, USAID, DFID, and Bloomberg Philanthropies. In addition to establishing the renowned International Management Development Programme (IMDP), which has trained more than 4,000 managers from 30 countries, Mr. Castro has strengthened the organisation's programmatic and operational functions. In 2014, Mr. Castro co-founded the Global TB Caucus, an international network of over 2,300 parliamentarians from more than 132 countries, with the Rt. Hon. Nick Herbert MP, of the UK, to accelerate progress against the tuberculosis epidemic. This revolutionary initiative remains one of the world's largest political networks dedicated to advancing a global health priority.



### **Shu-Ti Chiou**

Shu-Ti Chiou, M.D. (family medicine) & Ph.D. in epidemiology, is the former Director-General of Health Promotion Administration in Ministry of Health and Welfare, Taiwan 2009-2016, former Chair of the Governance Board of International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals & Health Services 2012-2014, and former Global Vice President for Partnerships of the International Union for Health Promotion & Education 2013-2016. She established the “Task Force on HPH & Environment” and the “Task Force on HPH & Age-friendly Health Care” in collaboration with the WHO Collaborating Center for Evidence-based Health Promotion in Hospitals. Dr. Chiou initiated several pioneering initiatives in health promotion & in healthcare delivery reforms, including healthy city & healthy settings development, breastfeeding policies, comprehensive cancer control policy, obesity prevention & control, regional diabetes shared care, health-promoting hospital initiative, age-friendly city & age-friendly healthcare initiative, etc., and published scientific papers on evidences of these programs’ impact & determinants of success.

Dr. Chiou has received many honorable awards, such as the Distinguished Achievement Award for Top Ten Outstanding Civil Servants (1999), the Award for Top Ten Outstanding Young Women in Taiwan (2000), the National Award for Model Civil Servants (1999 & 2012). Internationally, under her leadership, Taiwan was awarded with “the Network with Outstanding Fulfillment of Health Promoting Hospital Strategy” in 2013, and Taiwan’s cancer control plan and breast cancer control plan were rated with highest score among nine Asian countries and region in 2015 & 2016 respectively, its palliative care, the 6<sup>th</sup> in the world & the best in Asia in 2015, by the Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU).
